With these programs we have improved social, health, education, nutrition and economic conditions and reduced the poverty of our target beneficiaries.

For this financial year of 2025-26, the special focus of LMSSS will be on Poverty reduction among Poor and Marginalised rural households with Livelihoods, Ecological farming and Natural Resource Management, Food security programs, Sanitation programs, education and nutrition support to HIV/AIDS children programs.

Finally, I take this opportunity to thank his Excellency Rev. Dr. Udumala Bala, President of Lodi MSSS, Warangal for the support in rendering the services for the development of poor, needy and marginalised. PROGRAMS IMPLEMENTED

1. Title of the Project : Poverty reduction of marginalized households through resource protection management & promotion of agriculture in Hanumakonda district

Villages/Location : 22 villages of Dharmsagar and Velair mandals of Hanumakonda district

1) Overall Objective (Impact):

Reducing the poverty of poor and marginalized rural households in the district of Hanamkonda

Project Objective (Outcome)

10,750 poor and marginalized rural households improve their incomes sustainably

Output

- 1) Village development committees and user groups are established, operate independently and are actively involved in decision-making processes at village and project level
- 2) Small and marginal farmers increase their irrigated and cultivated areas by means of water storage and erosion control measures
- 3) Marginalised and disadvantaged small and marginal farmers practice ecological and diversified agriculture.
- 4) Marginalized and disadvantaged women sustainably keep farm animals and cultivate kitchen gardens



2) Activities Implemented

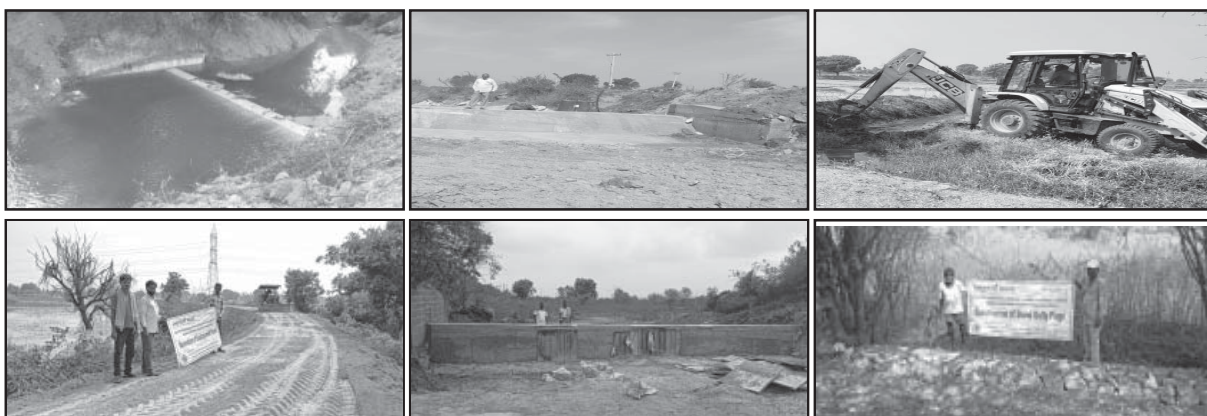


3) Achievements

- 1) Trained 11 project staff on Community organisation, Committees Formation/strengthening, Staff roles responsibilities, Project goal, objectives, Outcome and output results, activities, reporting, documentation and monitoring

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- 2) Trained 11 project staff on Soil and water conservation methods and water harvesting measures and livestock and fodder development measures, monitoring methods and tools of data collection, monitoring formats , case studies, annual project activities and output results.
 - 3) 44 project level committee members attended meeting and discussed on the project activities, selection and contribution from beneficiaries planning, implementation and monitoring of project activities
 - 4) Trained 500 women on Backyard vegetable gardening at village level to grow vegetables backyard and enhance income and vegetable consumption
 - 5) Trained 521 farmers on Organic farming, IPM/NPM methods to promote natural farming methods and to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients
 - 6) Training 400 farmers paddy cultivation practices, Green Manure, enriched compost making to reduce the cost of chemical fertilizers and pesticides and improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients
 - 7) Trained 400 farmers on growing of different varieties of vegetables with improved vegetable cultivation methods, promotion of millets and traditional crops to e reduce the investment cost and enhance yield and gain additional income.
 - 8) Trained 400 women on development of livestock and calf development, concentrated feed maintenance of livestock and veterinary care, promotion of fodder to enhance the milk yield and additional income of the target families
 - 9) 500 women were trained on promotion of backyard poultry, vaccination, feeding to poultry and to enhance secondary income of the target families in 16 villages
 - 10) 400 farmers gained knowledge on soil moisture conservation measures, and water harvesting and management systems to improve soil fertility, surface and ground water sources for irrigation purpose
 - 11) 54 Farmers and 11 project staff were taken to exposure to Rollakallu village and learnt about better cotton growing initiatives with multi crops, pest management, vermi compost, vermi wash, soil testing for better yield, crop with less investment.
 - 12) Distributed 6 varieties of vegetable seeds 500 women to promote Backyard vegetable gardening to enhance income and vegetable consumption
 - 13) 360 farmers were provided with plastic drums, cans neem oil, growth promoter, yellow plates, pheromone traps, sprayer pumps, solar light traps to promote ecological farming methods to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients
 - 14) Distributed 10 varieties of vegetable seeds to 100 farmers to promote improved vegetable cultivation and get additional income and fresh vegetables, for consumption purpose
 - 15) Distributed mulching sheet, green shady net, support net, fruit fly traps to 100 farmers to promote improved vegetable cultivation and get additional income and fresh vegetables, for consumption purpose.

- 16) Distributed to 200 farmers millets and traditional crop seeds to enhance income with less investment.
- 17) Distributed biofertilizers -zinc sulphate, Trichoderma and Pseudomonas to 100 farmers to promote Enriched composting for different crops to improve plant growth and soil nutrients
- 18) Distributed to 200 farmers green manure seeds to promote green manure in paddy fields and improve soil fertility and nutrients.
- 19) 200 women were provided with concentrate feed and minerals nutrient bags for female calves to enhance the nutrients among calves and ensure that calves become dairy cattle and later yield milk.
- 20) Distributed fodder seeds to 200 members to grow fodder for milk animals and enhance milk yield
- 21) .Distributed 20 Aseel chicks each to 500 target women /500 units and total 10,000 Aseel chicks under Backyard Poultry promotion to enhance secondary income in 16 project villages



- 22) Renovated 20 Feeder channel in 15 project villages and 400 farmers were benefitted with increase of irrigation and recharge of bore wells.
- 23) Renovated 20 small ponds in 13 project villages are renovated by clearance of jungle on the bund and strengthened the bund and 600 farmers were benefitted with the increase of irrigation sources
- 24) Constructed 6 weir on 6 traditional irrigation tanks in 4 project villages to increase storage capacity and 180 farmers will be benefitted with enhanced irrigation from bore wells and wells.
- 25) Constructed 5 check dam in 5 villages on big stream and 200 farmers will be benefited with recharge of ground water and enhanced irrigation from bore wells and wells.
- 26) Constructed 513 stone gullies in farmer's agricultural lands in 128 acres of 128 farmers in 2 project villages to control the soil erosion and increase the soil moisture retention capacity.

2. Sustainable Livelihood Based Food Security program for the Tribal, Dalit and Backward Class Communities of 23 villages of Akkannapet Mandal of Siddipet district.

1) **Objective:** Food security is enhanced among 1,325 families in 23 project villages (5 panchayat villages and 17 habitation villages) of Akkannapet mandal, Siddipet district and will experience access to sustainable livelihood options for year-round food security.

2) Activities Implemented:

1. Village Committee meeting on planning and implementation
2. Farmers training on organic farming, IPM/NPM methods, Vermi compost.
3. Farmers training on soil moisture conservation & water harvesting structures and water management
4. Farmers training on Promotion of multi cropping and traditional crops and vegetable gardens
5. Training on livelihood, fodder development and veterinary care
6. Linkages meeting for the benefit of women and farmers with government departments and Panchayat Raj institutions on Government schemes
7. Exposure Visit to farmers on Organic Farming
8. Promotion of organic agriculture
9. Promotion of traditional seed
10. Promotion Fodder Development
11. Distribution of Vegetable seeds for Vegetable Garden
12. Promotion of Backyard poultry
13. Construction of Vermi pits
14. Deepening of the Irrigation open wells
15. Desiltation of irrigation tanks
16. Construction of check dams



3) Achievements in this reporting period:

1. 23 village committees were formed and every month 230 farmers & women were participated in planning and implementation of project activities.
2. We have conducted 8 cluster level meetings and 255 Marginalized farmers gained knowledge on organic farming, IPM/NPM methods, Vermi compost.
3. 259 Farmers gained knowledge on soil moisture conservation & water harvesting structures and water management
4. From 8 trainings, 250 Farmers gained knowledge on Promotion of multi cropping and traditional crops and vegetable gardens
5. 187 Marginalized farmers gained knowledge on livelihood, fodder, veterinary care
6. 100 Village committee members were trained on linkage meeting on government schemes
7. Through exposure trip 94 farmers and 6 staff have gained knowledge organic farming cultivation, preparation of Jeevamurutham, Gana jeevamrutham and also use of pest control repellents like neem oil, neem powder etc.
8. 318 Marginalized farmers were received plastic drums, neem oil & pheromone traps and were practicing organic methods in 78 acres of land in 23 project villages
9. 690 Farmers were received traditional food crop seeds and cultivated in 92 acres of land in 23 project villages
10. 200 farmers have received Fodder seeds cultivated in 89 acres of land for animal development and increased the quantity of milk in 23 project villages.
11. 1161 Women have received 5 varieties of kitchen garden seeds and 248 women have received vegetable seeds for vegetable garden and cultivated in 92 acres of land.
12. 415 Women members were received backyard poultry units and poultry feeding from 23 villages and using eggs, improved nutrients in their daily food.
13. Constructed 200 Vermi pits units for 200 farmers from 23 villages and prepared and applied the vermi compost in 132 acres of land and got good yield.
14. 32 Open wells were deepened and 32 Farmers were benefited through deepening open wells and enhanced irrigation for 39 acres of paddy fields.
15. 6,000 tractor trips of desiltation taken in 2 irrigation tanks in 2 villages and applied in 126 acres of 128 farmers to improve soil moisture conservation and moisture retention, soil fertility of agriculture land.
16. Constructed 1 check dam in 1 village and 25 farmers will benefit with increase of irrigation sources to 21 acres of land through recharge of bore wells and open wells.

3. Sustainable agriculture based Food Security and Livelihood for tribal, dalit & backward communities in Chennaraopet Mandal of Warangal District

1) **Project Goal:** Enhancement of Sustainable agriculture Food Security programs and sustainable livelihood for marginalized farmers & landless families for 4000 target families who belong to SC ST and backward communities in 20 selected villages of Chennaraopet mandal of Warangal district in Telangana state, India

2) **Key activities:**

- ❖ Village meeting and Village committee formation
- ❖ Farmers training on organic NPM/IPM and soil moisture
- ❖ Exposure visit
- ❖ Linkage meetings on Govt Schemes
- ❖ Renovation of irrigation ponds

- ❖ Promotion of vegetable demonstration plots



3) **Major achievements**

- Organized 20 village level meetings and formed 20 village committees with 200 farmers, women, village leaders, PRI members and youth members in 20 villages.
- 200 farmers gained knowledge on water management methods and natural resource management methods from 20 project villages
- 60 farmers gained knowledge and practical experience on Organic farming through exposure visit to Gudur mandal .
- 200 members attended and gained knowledge through linkage meetings on Govt Schemes.
- 6-Irrigation ponds were renovated in 6 villages and 980 acres of land and 320 small farmers will be benefitted in Chennaraopet mandal

- 10-Feeder channels were renovated in 10 villages and 1040 acres of land and 900 farmers will be benefitted in Chennaraopet mandal.
- 200-women members received 6 varieties of vegetable seeds for promotion of backyard garden in 20 villages
- 100-Marginalized farmers were received 6 varieties of vegetable seeds for promotion of vegetable cultivation demonstration plots in 20 villages
- 100 Farmers received spray pumps, neem oil & yellow plates and were practicing organic farming methods in 100 acres of land in 20 project villages.

4. Empowered communities' foster climate resilient and climate adaptive agriculture and livelihoods at Guduru mandal - UJWALA PHASE II

1) Over all Objectives

- a. Food and Livelihood Security is expanded through promoting Climate Resilient Agriculture and Livelihoods

3) Results achieved:

- 1) 75 selected Community people gained knowledge on off farm activities.
- 2) 80 farmers gained knowledge on preventing losses after harvesting and value additions.
- 3) 48 farmers gained knowledge on marketing with concerned agencies through the meeting.
- 4) 350 villagers were benefited by vegetable seeds distribution through this program.
- 5) 55 Farmers gained knowledge on Agronomic practices in field level demonstrative learning in the target villages.
- 6) 75 Community people gained knowledge on Integrated Organic Farming, Horticulture, traditional best practices.
- 7) 52 Selected SHG members were trained on skill based IGP program.
- 8) Developed a booklet on Organic farming methods.
- 9) 60 selected farmers gained knowledge on protect indigenous seeds, and received black rice, Navara rice seeds & different millet seeds.
- 10) 16 Members Govt officials participated in this program from agriculture department.
- 11) 62 farmers were orientated on food chain network, processing, value addition, water management, IPM, NPM etc.
- 12) 45 selected farmers visited field of organic farming through exposure visit.
- 13) 100 farmers gained knowledge through other farmers sharing and learning on organic farming.
- 14) 31 farmers got the indigenous seeds in the village level agriculture festival.

- 15) 138 Local stakeholders, line department, ward member from GP and migrant labours were sensitized on Develop strategies, cross learning, identify the focus areas regarding community resources & needs in the 9 target villages.
- 16) 10 Nutrition Gardens were developed in 5 Anganwadi schools and 5 Govt. Primary schools.
- 17) 39 selected farmers received black rice, green gram and maize under climate resilience models developing.
- 18) 72 Volunteers improved knowledge on Agri and allied practices.
- 19) 48 Farmers and villagers gained knowledge on various Govt. Schemes.
- 20). 115 volunteers were sensitized on Develop strategies, cross learning, identify the focus areas regarding community resource, needs and sustainable livelihood development.

5. CABA- (CLHA / CAA) Program - Children Affected by AIDS

- 1) **Project objective:** Empowering Children Affected / Infected by HIV/AIDS (CABA) through Linkages, Skill Building and Peer Support services in India
- 2) **Activities Conducted**
 - 1) Nutrition Support
 - 2) Child Counselling and Education support to CLHA / CAA Children
 - 3) Vocational trainings to CLHA / CAA
 - 4) Digital literacy training program to CLHA / CAA
 - 5) District level Coordination meeting



3) Achievements:

- 1) Nutrition Support (Peanut , Red gram, Oil, sugar, wheat powder, pulses Soaps, Thoor Dal, Black gram Jiggery, and Peanut chikky) to 100 HIV Infected Children for the months of October-2024 & March 2025
- 2) Child Counselling and Education support for 320 Affected / Infected Children
- 3) Vocational training was conducted and trained 100 CLHA/ CAA members on Electrician, Tailoring and Motor driving courses .

- 4) Digital literacy training program 12 CLHA members were trained.
- 5) District level Coordination meeting was conducted with 42 members and discussed on CLHA/ CAA issues and services.

6. Help to HIV infected and affected Children

- 1) **Aim.** LMSSS pays attention to fulfil the basic needs with nutrition support to HIV infected and affected children. Nutrition and Education support is provided through Lodi MSSS to HIV infected and affected orphan, semi orphans and positive children to keep them healthy and active.

2) Activities taken

- i. Nutrition Support
- ii. Education support
- iii. Semi-Christmas celebration
- iv. Children's Day celebration
- v. Capacity building Programmes



3) Achievements:

- 1) Nutrition Support (Peanut, Dal, Oil, Sugar, Wheat powder, Red gram, Black Gram, pulses Soaps, Thoor Dal, Peanut chikky Dats) to 150 HIV Infected Children once in two months (6 times per year)
- 2) Education support for 254 Children (Note books, Stationary, School and College bags) on 24th June, 2024
- 3) Christmas gifts of New dresses were given to CLHA / CLA and Disabled children on 11th December, 2024
- 4) 2 CLHA children got Private job in Software company in Bangalore, 1 CLHA child got job in Bajaj finance company in Hyderabad and 1 CLHA girl is Preparing for Group exams supported by LODI M S S S

- 5) 3 girls with HIV Positive got married with the support of LODI Society.

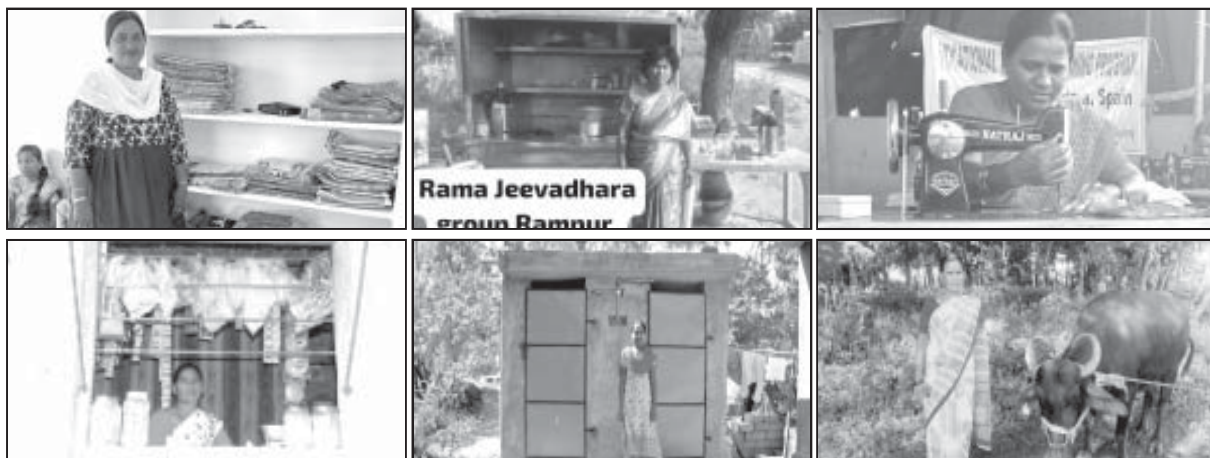
7. Kolping Activities

1) Aim of the project

Kolping Centre is committed to promote the Empowerment of the poor and downtrodden Kolping families by promoting integral development in Social, Economic, Political, Spiritual and Cultural fields

2) Objectives

- To provide Self employment training opportunities to 200 Kolping families on different trades each year
- To raise the income level of the trained families from 60-70%
- To arrest the migration of Women and youth from rural to urban in search of employment
- Improve the health and nutritional status of the beneficiaries and their family members



3) Activities undertaken

- Training on Empowerment of Women in political, social and economic fields
- Training on Micro credit for Self-Employment
- Trainings to Women and Youth Farmers on organic Farming
- Education Support to Kolping Families
- Promotion of Income Generation Programs
- Support for Housing
- Support to Sanitation program
- Support for milch animal program.

4) Results achieved

- 170 Women group members were trained on Empowerment of Women in political, social and economic fields in village level.

- 136 Women group members were trained on Micro credit for Self-Employment.
- 96 Women group members and Youth Farmers were trained on organic Farming.
- 10 families received financial support for education
- 550 Women group members were supported with Rs.1,10,00,000/- for Income Generation Programs loans
- 8 Kolping families received Rs.50000/- each family and total Rs.4,00,000/- for house construction
- 50 Kolping families received Rs.7,50,000/- for sanitation program
- 40 Kolping family members received Rs.4,00,000/- for milch animal and 10 members Special loan for goat rearing

8. Lodi Revolving Fund to Women and Farmers SHG members
