#### PRESIDENT MESSAGE

#### Millets a Food Choice for the Future

Need of the hour is to make millets a food choice for the future" "Millets are good for the consumer, cultivator and climate" "Millets are a good way to increase agricultural and dietary diversity" "Raising awareness to create 'Millet Mindfulness' is an important part of this movement"

Millets have been an integral part of our diet for centuries. In addition to a plethora of health benefits, millets are also good for the environment with low water & input requirement. Millets are in the news these days because of their



high nutritional value and other benefits. Due to their high nutritional value, millets are referred to as "nutri-cereals". Despite being a staple food source for hundreds of millions of people worldwide, its production is declining now. With the aim to create awareness and increase production & consumption of millets, United Nations, at the behest of the Government of India, declared 2023 the International Year Millets.

The objectives of declaring 2023 as the International Year of Millets are as follows:

- Elevate awareness of the contribution of millets to food security and nutrition.
- Inspire stakeholders on improving sustainable production and quality of millets.
- Draw focus on enhanced investment in research and development and extension services to achieve the other two aims.

Millets are proven to be extremely good for health. Being gluten-free they are fit for consumption by those who are gluten intolerant. They are known to reduce the risk of heart diseases as they keep a check on cholesterol levels. Children on a millet diet have reduced occurrence of asthma and other breathing ailments. It is highly beneficial for postmenopausal women to keep their blood pressure and cholesterol under control. Recent research studies have also indicated that the regular consumption of millets is associated with reduced risk of type 2 diabetes mellitus. With these established benefits, it is first important to understand how millets trend in the current world's food basket. While six great cereals that dominate the intake trend are wheat, rice, corn, barley, oats, and rye, their occurrence and consumption depends mainly on the climatic conditions. While oats and rye are dominant in colder regions of the world, wheat and barley are popular in the warm temperate regions. The third category that dominates tropical zones comprises rice, maize, and millets. Millets are a collective group of small seeded annual grasses that are grown as grain crops, primarily on marginal land in dry areas of temperate, sub-tropical, and tropical regions.

There are several types of millets consumed by Indian households. The most popular being sorghum (jowar), pearl millet (bajra), and finger millet (ragi). While wheat, rice and maize dominate as the

'big three' in terms of world's mega production; millets along with barley, oats, rye, and sorghum make up the second position.

Millets are considered as super food as Millets provide body with several minerals like calcium, iron, manganese and more. Not just that, they are loaded with antioxidants, fibre and protein too. All these factors may help prevent obesity and promote weight loss.

Millet is a storehouse of iron who helps maintain body's iron content. This might further help prevent iron deficiency and related problems like anaemia. The high amount of calcium, manganese, magnesium, zinc, potassium, copper and other such minerals make millet a great option to strengthen bone health. Millets are food grains that may help regulate blood sugar levels, due to the presence of high-quality carbohydrates, fibre and high levels of protein. Several studies have also shown that some types of millets can help boost heart health too and prevent heart disease like atherosclerosis.

As this year is declared as International Year Millets 2023, Lodi MSSS is also creating awareness among the target community on cultivation of millet crops and consumption of millets for food security and nutrition. Lodi MSSS is working with marginalised and small farmer to ehance their income and improve their food security through soil, water conservation management, ecological farming and traditional, vegetable and millet crops. We are training the farmers on promotion of millets like sorghum, pearl millet (bajra), and finger millet (ragi) in our working areas to improve diversity of crops and crop rotations. They are also more resilient to changes in climate than any other cereals. We are educating farmers to promote millets as they need minimum inputs, are resistant to diseases and pests and offer a reduced dependence on synthetic fertilisers and pesticides.

We are encouraging farmers to enhance their income with less investment with promotion of millets. We are creating awareness of the nutritional and health benefits of millets and promoting millets as a key component of the food basket. We are also creating awareness to general community on consumption of millets as it has rich minerals and protein and boost health conditions. With all the experience in implementing Food Security, climate adaptive agriculture and livelihoods programs, Lodi MSSS will also continue to work to create awareness to the target people on promotion of millets. We assure we will work to ensure Millets a Food choice for the future of all.

This year we have achieved four new projects 1. Sustainable Livelihood Based

Food Security program for the Tribal and Dalit Communities of 16 villages of Tharigoppula mandal of Jangaon district. 2. Strengthening child friendly local governance and hazard preparedness at GP level, Wardhanapeta mandal, 3. Emergency Relief to flood affected Communities in Manthini Mandal, Warangal Diocese and 4. Sustainable Safe & Clean Water - SPED-VII – Drinking water and individual Household toilets in 20 villages.

This year our major achievements are we have supported with food kits to 200 flood victim families from Suraiahpalli village of Manthini mandal who were affected with Godavari river floods. We have supported 300 poor target families for construction of 300 individual Household Toilets in 20 villages with the support of Save A Family Plan India.

During this year we have also implemented Food Security, climate adaptive agriculture and livelihoods, Disabled children, HIV/AIDS, Women empowerment, Cancer Campaign program, Youth and Child line programs. With these programs we have improved the living, social, health, nutrition and economic conditions of our target beneficiaries.

For this financial year of 2023-24, LMSSS special focus will be on Poverty reduction and food security program, adaptive agriculture and livelihoods, Safe drinking water and Sanitation programs, Cancer Campaign program and education and nutrition support to HIV/AIDS children programs.

Finally I take this opportunity to thank his Excellency Rev. Dr. Udumala Bala, President of Lodi MSSS, Warangal for the support in rendering the services for the development of poor. I thank all the General and Executive body members, staff, donors for all the kind support and cooperation in implementing the programs in Lodi MSSS. I am grateful to you all and assure you all Lodi MSSS will continue to work and support to reach the unreached poor and marginalized.

#### PROGRAMS IMPLEMENTED

# 1.Poverty Reduction and Food Security for Disadvantaged Rural Households in the Jangaon District through Organic Farming and Animal Husbandry in Kodakandla mandal, Jangaon district

#### **Overall objective (Impact):**

The living conditions of marginalised and poor rural families in the Jangaon District are improved

#### **Project purpose (Outcome)**

Marginalised and poor families in 16 project villages achieve higher income and improve their food security through community village administration, active resource conservation management, ecological farming and keeping livestock.

#### Output

- 1) Self-help structures are established and function independently and participatively
- 2) the size of the irrigated and cultivated areas has increased due to water and erosion control measures
- 3) Marginalised and disadvantaged small farmers practice ecological and diversified agriculture
- 4) Marginalised and disadvantaged women practice sustainable ways of keeping livestock.

## **Villages/Location** : 16 project villages of Kodakandla mandal, Jangaon district **Activities Implemented**

- 1) Staff training
- 2) Training on soil moisture conservation and water harvesting & management to farmers
- 3) Training on ecological farming methods
- 4) Training on mixed vegetable cropping

- 1. Organised three days staff training and trained field staff on process documentation, monitoring formats, Methods and tools of data collection, case studies etc.
- 2. 22 farmers gained knowledge on soil moisture conservation measures, and water harvesting and management systems to improve soil fertility, surface and ground water sources for irrigation purpose
- 3. 144 farmers were trained on ecological farming methods, waste decomposer bacteria, Jeevamrutham, Ghana Jeevamarutham methods and homeo medicines to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients, control of pest etc.
- 4. Trained 95 farmers on mixed vegetable cropping systems in agriculture fields to enhance income and vegetable consumption
- 5. Trained 100 farmer on mixed cropping with traditional and millet crops to enhance income with less investment.
- 6. 190 women were trained on promotion of backyard poultry, vaccination, feeding to poultry and to enhance secondary income of the target families.
- 7. 28 women were trained on promotion of milk animals, livestock, and fodder development and veterinary care to enhance secondary income and nutrition of the target families with milk yield.
- 8. 40 Farmers and field staff were taken to exposure to Rollakallu- Navajeevana FPO, Thorrur Harichandana FPO, Raheemkanpet Thiyati thena FPO, Gundla Nallathalli FPO and learnt about Paddy procurement centre, quality cotton procurement, honey bee making, agriculture input services provided to farmers through the FPOs.
- 9. 32 Mandal development committee members with the project staff have attended the meetings and planned, reviewed and monitored the implementation and follow up, maintainenace of the activities at the project level.

- 10.60 farmers participated in linkage meeting and district and mandal agriculture officers attended meeting and shared and discussed on agriculture issues, schemes, crop diseases and pest management.
- 11.100 farmers were provided with plastic drums, cans, yellow plates to promote natural farming for preparation of waste decomposer bacteria, Jeevamrutham, neem powder, neem oil, growth promoters and homeo medicines to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients, control of pest etc
- 12. 250 promoted ecological farming methods like in 250 acres of land and waste decomposer bacteria, Jeevamrutham, Neem powder, vermi compost, neem oil, growth promoters and homeo medicines, pheromone trap, yellow plates to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients, control of pest etc.
- 13. Distributed to 200 farmers 10 varieties of vegetable seeds to enhance income and vegetable consumption
- 14. Distributed to 50 farmers five varieties of traditional and millet crops to enhance income with less investment.
- 15. Distributed fodder seeds to 40 members for the promotion of milk animals and enhancement of milk yield
- 16. Promoted Backyard Poultry to 600 target women /600 units and distributed 6000 Aseel chicks to enhance secondary income in 12 project villages.
- 17. Constructed 525 stone gullies in farmer's agricultural lands in 132 acres of 132 farmers in 10 project villages to control the soil erosion and increase the soil moisture retention capacity.
- 18. Constructed 120 rock fill dams in 10 villages over the small streams and 60 farmers will be benefitted with recharge of ground water and 20 acres of land will be enhanced with irrigation sources.
- 19. 20,060 tractor trips of tank silt from 5 irrigation tanks, 5 project villages was applied in 1004 acres of agriculture land of 502 small and marginal farmers with desiltation program.
- 20. Constructed 3 check dams in 2 villages on big stream and 95 acres of land of 90 farmers will be benefitted with recharge of ground water and enhanced irrigation from bore wells and wells.
- 21. Constructed 2 weirs on 2 small ponds in 2 project villages to increase storage capacity and 60 farmers will be benefitted with enhanced irrigation from bore wells and wells.
- 22. Renovated 5 small ponds in 5 project villages are renovated by clearance of jungle on the bund and strengthened the bund and 150 farmers were benefitted with the increase of irrigation sources.
- 23. Renovated 2 Feeder channel in 2 project villages and 50 farmers were benefitted with increase of irrigation and recharge of bore wells.
- 24. Distributed revolving loans of Rs.25,90,000 to 87 women for promotion of milk animals
- 25. Distributed revolving loans of Rs.20,75,000 to 110 farmers agriculture development

# 2. Sustainable Livelihood Based Food Security program for the Tribal and Dalit Communities of 16 villages of Tharigoppula Mandal of Jangaon district.

1).Objective: Food security is enhanced among 1250 families in 16 project villages (5 panchayat villages and 11 habitation villages) of Tharigoppula mandal, Jangaon district and will experience access to sustainable livelihood options for year-round food security.

- 2) Farmers training on organic farming, IPM/NPM methods, Vermi compost.
- 3) Farmers training on soil moisture conservation & water harvesting structures and water management
- 4)Farmers training on Promotion of multi cropping and traditional crops and vegetable gardens
- 5) Training on livelihood, fodder development and veterinary care
- 6) Linkages meeting for the benefit of women and farmers with government departments and Panchayat Raj institutions on Government schemes
- 7) Exposure Visit to farmers on Organic Farming
- 8) Promotion of organic agriculture
- 9) Promotion of traditional seed
- 10) Promotion Fodder Development
- 11) Distribution of Vegetable seeds for Vegetable garden
- 12) Promotion of Backyard poultry
- 13) Construction of Vermi pits
- 14) Deepening of the Irrigation open wells
- 15) Desiltation of 2 irrigation tanks
- 16) Construction of check dams



- a. 16 village committees were formed and every month 370 farmers & women were participated in planning and implementation of project activities.
- b. 327 Marginalized farmers gained knowledge on organic farming, IPM/NPM methods, Vermi compost.
- c. 312 Farmers gained knowledge on soil moisture conservation & water harvesting structures and water management
- d. 372 Farmers gained knowledge on Promotion of multi cropping and traditional crops and vegetable gardens
- e. 154 Marginalized farmers gained knowledge on livelihood, fodder, veterinary care
- f. 202 Village committee members were trained on linkage meeting on government schemes
- g. Through exposure trip 64 farmers and 6 staff have gained knowledge organic farming cultivation, preparation of organic manure like Jeevamurutham, Ganajeevamrutham etc., also preparation of pest control repents like neem oil and the water harvesting structures.
- h. 224 Marginalized farmers were received plastic drums, neem oil & pheromone traps and were practicing organic methods in 82 acres of land in 16 project villages
- 237 Farmers were received traditional food crop seeds and cultivated in 128 acres of land in 16 project villages
- j. 168 farmers have received Fodder seeds cultivated in 78 acres of land for animal development and increased the quantity of milk in 16 project villages.
- k. 738 Women have received 5 varieties of vegetable seeds and cultivated in 98 acres of land.
- 1. 400 Women members were received backyard poultry units from 16 villages and using eggs, improved nutrients in their daily food.
- m. Constructed 200 Vermi pits units for 200 farmers from 16 villages and prepared and applied the vermi compost in 124 acres of land and got good yield.
- n. 30 Open wells were deepened and 61 Farmers were benefited through deepening open wells and enhanced irrigation for 83 acres of paddy fields.
- o. 6,000 tractor trips of desiltation taken in 2 irrigation tanks in 2 villages and applied in 97 acres of 62 farmers to improve soil moisture conservation and moisture retention, soil fertility of agriculture land.
- p. Constructed 2 check dam in 2 villages and 68 farmers will benefit with increase of irrigation sources to 127 acres of land through recharge of bore wells and open wells.

# 3. Improvement of income situation and Food security for marginalized groups in 20 project villages of Raikal mandal, Jagityal District,

#### 1).Project Goal:

4,050 poor households from 20 villages in the Jagityal District improve their food and income situation

#### **Specific objective:**

- 1. A total of 3,065 households of small farmers and marginalized farmers as well as 985 landless households have established production-enhancing agricultural techniques and income-generating measures.
- 2. A total of 4,050 families living below the poverty line improve their participation in local politics through participation in self-help groups and thus participate in change processes
- 3. The partner organization Lodi has built up institutional and technical capacities to better support the target group
- 4. The improved lobbying ensures the necessary structural integration and support of the project at district and state level

- 8-Project staff members were trained on project sustainability and increased their knowledge on project goals and actively implementing the project activities to reach the project goal.
- 40 Members of Mandal Development Committee was trained on project goals, objectives & sustainability and increased their involvement in the project implementation.
- 100- Farmers were trained on linkage meeting at mandal level with government officials from Veterinary department, Horticulture department and lobbying with them for subsidy material
- 6 Check dams were constructed in 6 villages and 145 acres of land will be irrigated with recharge of 86 open wells and 92 bore wells
- 4-Rock fill dams were constructed in 1 project village and 16 acres of land controlled soil erosion.
- 200- Stone gullies were constructed in 5 project villages and 325 acres of land controlled soil erosion.
- 3-Rennovation of feeder channels were repaired in 3 villages and 70 farmers were benefitted and 68 acres of land irrigation enhanced
- 3-Desiltation of irrigation tanks in 3 villages and 300 farmers were benefitted and 74 acres of land fertility enhanced.
- 88 small farmers were received plastic drums, can, neem oil and preparing the organic solutions to protect their crop without fertilizers and chemicals.
- Distributed 8 varieties of vegetable seed for kitchen gardens to 300 families and increased additional income and vegetable consumption in 20 project villages

## 4. Livelihood Based Food Security program for the tribal and dalit communities at Kothaguda Mandal of Mahabubabad district

1) Aim of the Project: To bring about overall sustainable development by improving livelihood and income generation among 5000 marginalized families (belonging to the SC, ST and backward

communities) in 30 villages of Kothaguda Mandal of Mahabubabad District within the State of Telangana in India.

#### 2) Objectives of the project:

- i. To improve the knowledge and awareness levels among the communities on the importance of nutrition, health, livelihoods, agriculture and natural resource management in improving livelihood and bringing about sustainable development.
- ii. To establish community support systems through formation of Community Groups (CBG) and capacitating the leaders to play a lead role in improving among the community members through improved agricultural production, and natural resource management.
- iii. To build the capacities of marginalized farmers on improving agricultural productivity.
- iv. To build the capacities of farmers on effective methods of natural resource management in order to improve agricultural yields.
- **v.** To build the capacities of women on activities pertaining to alternative sources of income generation.
