

We have also implemented Food Security, Organic farming, Natural resource management, climate adaptive agriculture and livelihoods, education and nutrition support to children affected by HIV/AIDS, Physically Disabled children, Child line programs, women empowerment, promotion of milk animals, safe drinking water, housing and sanitation programs. With these programs we have improved the living, social, health, nutrition and economic conditions and reduced the poverty of our target beneficiaries.

For this financial year of 2024-25, the special focus of LMSSS will be on Poverty reduction among the Poor and Marginalised rural households with Livelihoods, Ecological farming and Natural Resource Managementand food security programs, adaptive agriculture and Safe drinking water and Sanitation programs, education and nutrition support to HIV/AIDS children programs.

Finally, I take this opportunity to thank His Excellency Most Rev. Dr. Udumala Bala, President of Lodi MSSS, Warangal for the support in rendering the services for the development of poor and marginalised. I thank all the General and Executive body members, staff, donors for all the kind support and cooperation in implementing the programs through Lodi MSSS. PROGRAMS IMPLEMENTED

1. Poverty Reduction and Food Security for Disadvantaged Rural Households in the Jangaon District through Organic Farming and Animal Husbandry in Kodakandla mandal, Jangaon district

Overall objective (Impact):

The living conditions of marginalised and poor rural families in the Jangaon District are improved Project purpose (Outcome):

Marginalised and poor families in 16 project villages achieve higher income and improve their food security through community village administration, active resource conservation management, ecological farming and keeping livestock.

Output

- 1) Self-help structures are established and function independently and participatively
- 2) the size of the irrigated and cultivated areas has increased due to water and erosion control measures
- 3) Marginalised and disadvantaged small farmers practice ecological and diversified agriculture
- 4) Marginalised and disadvantaged women practice sustainable ways of keeping livestock. Villages/Location: 16 project villages of Kodakandla mandal, Jangaon district

Activities Implemented

- 1) Training on mixed vegetable cropping
- 2) Training on ecological farming methods
- 3) Mandal development committee meeting
- 4) Linkage meeting
- 5) Exposure program to farmers
- 6) Promotion of ecological farming
- 7) Promotion of Vegetable seeds
- 8) Promotion of fodder seed
- 9) Promotion of traditional seed
- 10) Desiltation of big irrigation tanks
- 11) Construction of Stone gully plugs in fields
- 12) Construction of Check dams
- 13) Construction of Weir on existing small ponds
- 14) Renovation of existing small ponds
- 15) Renovation of feeder channels to existing irrigation tanks









Output Results achieved

- 1. Trained 105 farmers on mixed vegetable cropping systems in agriculture fields to enhance income and vegetable consumption
- 2. 20 farmers were trained on ecological farming methods, waste decomposer bacteria, Jeevamrutham, Ghana Jeevamarutham methods and homeo medicines to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients, control of pest etc.
- 3. 30 Mandal development committee members with the project staff have attended the meetings and planned reviewed and monitored the implementation and follow up, maintainenance of the activities at the project level
- 4. 50 farmers participated in linkage meeting and mandal agriculture officer attended meeting and shared and discussed on agriculture issues, schemes, crop diseases and pest management.
- 5. 20 Farmers were taken for exposure to cholleru village, Bhongiri district Cholleru FPO and learnt about redgram processing unit, agriculture input services provided to farmers through the FPO.
- 6. 150 farmers were provided with spray pumps, neem oil, growth promoter, solar light traps, neem powder, yellow plates to promote to promote natural farming waste decomposer bacteria, Jeevamrutham methods and to improve the soil fertility and soil nutrients.
- 7. Distributed to 150 farmers 10 varieties of vegetable seeds to enhance income and vegetable consumption
- 8. 150 farmers were provided with tarpaulin sheets, shady net, stacking wire, to promote mixed vegetable gardens and to enhance income and vegetable consumption
- 9. Distributed fodder seeds to 80 members to grow fodder for milk animals and enhance milk yield
- 10. Distributed to 78 farmers traditional crop seeds to enhance income with less investment.
- 11. 4220 tractor trips of tank silt from 2 irrigation tanks, in 2 project villages was applied in 210 acres of agriculture land of 105 small and marginal farmers with desiltation program.
- 12. Constructed 900 stone gullies in farmers' agricultural lands in 225 acres of 225 farmers in 6 project villages to control the soil erosion and increase the soil moisture retention capacity.
- 13. Constructed 4 check dams in 4 villages on big stream and 105 farmers will be benefited with recharge of ground water and enhanced irrigation from bore wells and wells.
- 14. Constructed 1 weir on 1 small pond in 1 project villages to increase storage capacity and 30 farmers will be benefitted with enhanced irrigation from bore wells and wells.
- 15. Renovated 8small ponds in 8 project village are renovated by clearance of jungle on the bund and strengthened the bund and 250 farmers were benefitted with the increase of irrigation sources.
- 16. Renovated 6 Feeder channels in 5 project villages and 155 farmers were benefitted with increase of irrigation and recharge of bore wells.

- Sustainable Livelihood Based Food Security program for the Tribal and Dalit Communities of 16 villages of TharigoppulaMandal of Jangaon district.
- 1) <u>Objective:</u> Food security is enhanced among 1250 families in 16 project villages (5 panchayat villages and 11 habitation villages) of Tharigoppula mandal, Jangaon district and will experience access to sustainable livelihood options for year-round food security.

2) Activities Implemented:

- a. Farmers training on organic farming, IPM/NPM methods, Vermi compost.
- b. Farmers training on soil moisture conservation & water harvesting structures and water management
- c. Farmers training on Promotion of multi cropping and traditional crops and vegetable gardens
- d. Training on livelihood, fodder development and veterinary care
- e. Linkages meeting for the benefit of women and farmers with government departments and Panchayat Raj institutions on Government schemes
- f. Promotion of organic agriculture
- g. Promotion of traditional seed
- h. Distribution of Vegetable seeds for Kitchen Garden and Vegetable garden
- i. Promotion Fodder Development
- j. Promotion of Backyard poultry
- k. Construction of Vermi Compost Pits
- 1. Construction of Check dams
- m. Deepening of the 30 Irrigation open wells
- n. Desiltation of 2 irrigation tanks

3) Achievements in this reporting period:

- 183 Marginalized farmers gained knowledge on organic farming, IPM/NPM methods, Vermi compost.
- 159 Farmers gained knowledge on soil moisture conservation & water harvesting structures and water management
- 167 Farmers gained knowledge on Promotion of multi cropping and traditional crops and vegetable gardens
- 176 Marginalized farmers gained knowledge on livelihood, fodder, veterinary care
- 172 Village committee members when trained on linkage meeting on government schemes
- 184 Marginalized farmers received Yellow plates, Neem oil & Pheromone traps and were practicing organic methods in 47 acres of land in 16 project villages
- 234 Farmers received traditional food crop seeds and cultivated in 116 acres of land in 16 project villages

- 624 Women and farmers have received 5 varieties of vegetable seeds for kitchen garden and vegetable garden and farmers cultivated in 98 acres of land.
- 161 farmers have received Fodder seeds cultivated in 81 acres of land for animal development and increased the quantity of milk in 16 project villages.
- 440 Women members received backyard poultry units from 16 villages and with selling of eggs, chicken enhanced their income and improved nutrients in their daily food.
- Constructed 480 Vermi pits units for 480 farmers from 16 villages and prepared and applied the vermi compost in 208 acres of land and got good yield.
- We had constructed 2 check dams in 2 villages and with these 19 open wells and 27 bore wells were recharged and 48 farmers improved irrigation to 38 acres of land.
- 30 Open wells were deepened and 30Farmers were benefited through deepening open wells and enhanced irrigation for 27 acres of paddy fields.
- 6,002 tractor trips of desiltation was taken in 2 irrigation tanks in 2 villages and applied in 341 acres of 167 farmers to improve soil moisture conservation and moisture retention, soil fertility of agriculture land.









3. Improvement of income situation and Food security for marginalized groups in 20 project villages of Raikal mandal, Jagityal District

1) Project Goal:

4,050 poor households from 20 villages in the Jagityal District improve their food and income situation **Specific objective:**

- 1. A total of 3,065 households of small farmers and marginalized farmers as well as 985 landless households have established production-enhancing agricultural techniques and income-generating measures.
- 2. A total of 4,050 families living below the poverty line improve their participation in local politics through participation in self-help groups and thus participate in change processes
- 3. The partner organization Lodi has built up institutional and technical capacities to better support the target group
- 4. The improved lobbying ensures the necessary structural integration and support of the project at district and state level

2) Activities Implemented:

- 1) Mandal Development Committee Meeting
- 2) Linkage meeting
- 3) Promotion of Natural farming/organic Farming
- 4) Promotion of organic kitchen garden.
- 5) Construction of Vermi pit units
- 6) Renovation of feeder channels
- 7) Renovation of Irrigation pond
- 8) Desiltation of irrigation tanks.

- 40 Members of Mandal Development Committee were trained on project goals and objectives and increased their involvement in the project implementation.
- 100 small and marginalized farmers were trained in linkage meetings on agriculture/horticulture schemes of Telangana state.
- Distributed Organic inputs like Neem oil, Pheromone Traps, Yellow sticks to 112 farmers in 20 project villages.
- Distributed 6 varieties of vegetable seeds for kitchen gardens to 100 families and increased additional income and vegetable consumption in 20 project villages.
- 56 Vermi pits were constructed in 8 villages and 56 farmers prepared vermi compost and used in crops and reduced investment on chemical fertilisers.

- 5-Existing Irrigation ponds were repaired in 5 villages and 175 small farmers were benefitted and increased 35 acres of dry land brought into cultivation.
- 8-Rennovation of feeder channels in 8 villages and 200 farmers were benefitted and 216 acres of land irrigation enhanced.
- 1 Desiltation of irrigation tank in 1 village and 64 farmers were benefitted and 94 acres of land fertility is enhanced.













4. Sustainable agriculture based Food Security and Livelihood for tribal, dalit & backward communities in Chennaraopet Mandal of Warangal District

1) <u>Project Goal:</u> Enhancement of Sustainable agriculture Food Security programs and sustainable livelihood for marginalized farmers & landless families for 4000 target families who belong to SC ST and backward communities in 20 selected villages of Chennaraopet mandal of Warangal district in Telangana state, India.

2) Project Objectives:

Objective 1:To create a platform through formation & strengthening of village committees and capacitating on agriculture, Natural resource management & livelihood based food security through increased agricultural production and natural resource structures.

Objective 2: To build the capacities of marginalized farmers on improving organic agricultural productivity through sustainability agriculture practices and promotion of organic agriculture and food crops.

Objective 3:To improve knowledge on natural resource management structures and capacitating the leaders and farmers on SGPs, Feeder channels & Irrigation ponds and its maintenance for increase of agriculture production.

Objective 4: To improve the knowledge and awareness levels among the target communities on sustainable livelihood support to increase the family income and increase health & nutrition support through kitchen garden & organic vegetable plots.

Objective 5: To improve women and farmers capacities on linkages for village development process and avail the welfare schemes by government.

3) Key activities:

- i) Village meeting and Village committee formation
- ii) Farmers training on organic NPM/IPM and soil moisture
- iii) Renovation of irrigation ponds
- iv) Renovation of feeder channels
- v) Promotion of Kitchen garden

4) Major achievements of reporting period:

- We have organized 20 village level meetings and formed 20 village committees with 200 farmers, women, village leaders, PRI members and youth members in 20 villages.
- 200 farmers gained knowledge on water management methods and natural resource management methods
- We have organized village level meeting for 280 farmers, women and village leaders on water management methods and natural resource management methods.

- 6 Irrigation ponds were renovated in 6 villages and 580 acres of land and 450 small farmers are benefitted in Chennaraopet mandal.
- 10 Feeder channels were renovated in 10 villages and 940 acres of land and 820 farmers are benefitted in Chennaraopet mandal.













5. Empowered communities' foster climate resilient and climate adaptive agriculture and livelihoods at Mahabubabad mandal & District - UJWALA PHASE II

1) Over all Objectives:

- a. Food and Livelihood Security is expanded through promoting Climate Resilient Agriculture and Livelihoods.
- b. Farmers' Producer organizations are making use of the possibilities for participation and greater involvement.

2) Activities implemented:

- 1. Meeting with Community institutions on Local resource identification & Management
- 2. Orientation meeting with community leaders
- 3. Awareness meeting on Allied Off farm Activities
- 4. Awareness meeting on Post harvest technologies
- 5. Exchange meetings of farmers group leaders (for sharing farming knowledge)
- 6. Organise Dialogue with duty bearers
- 7. Net working with Marketing agencies
- 8. Promotion of Seed, Agri. Inputs Banks and Nonfarm support
- 9. Promotion of appropriate Agronomic practices
- 10. Awareness meeting on Integrated Organic Family Farming
- 11. Training for Anganwadi / Asha / community workers on the importance of safe food practices & Sustainable Agriculture
- 12. Awareness meeting on Allied Off farm Activities
- 13. Skill Development training for low income group
- 14. Setting up of Nutrition Garden in Anganwadi & Govt. Schools
- 15. Millet Popularization Drive
- 16. Exposure visit
- 17. Setting up for Integrated Nutrition gardening for widows/PLWD
- 18. Setting up community nurseries for re-greening with nutritionally important trees.
- 19. Capacity Building training to volunteers
- 20. Orientation Meeting with Volunteers on Sustainable Livelihood.

3) Results achieved:

- 155 Community members participated in this program.
- 195 selected community members gained knowledge on identify community issues in local level, and possible coping strategies.
- 207 selected Community people gained knowledge on off farm activities.
- 271 farmers gained knowledge on to prevent losses after harvesting and value additions.
- 30 farmers participated and shared their own experience on cultivation and best practices.

- 178 farmers participated in Linkage meeting with agriculture department and KVK.
- 155 farmers gained knowledge on to marketing with concern agencies through this meeting.
- 647 villagers were provided with vegetable seeds through this program.
- 192 Farmers gained knowledge on Agronomic practices in field level for demonstrative learning's in the target villages.
- 218 Community people gained knowledge on Integrated Organic Farming, Horticulture, traditional best practices.
- 193 Community members. Asha and Anganwadi teachers participated in the meeting.
- 207 Community members and farmers gained knowledge on off farm activities.
- 70 Selected SHG members were trained on skill based IGP program.
- 4 Nutrition Gardens were established in Govt. Primary schools and Anganwadi centers.
- 66 Farmers gained knowledge on millet cultivation benefited millets seeds through this program.
- 10 Selected farmers visited field of organic farming through exposure visit.
- 150 widow and PLWD's were provided vegetable seeds and fruit plants through this program.
- 3 community nurseries for re-greening with nutritional plants.

• 40 selected volunteers gained knowledge on organic farming methods, and their role and

responsibilities in village developmental activities.

• 60 volunteers were sensitized on sustainable livelihoods.















6. Sneha Hastham Cancer campaign project

a) Goal: Sensitization and mobilization of the community recourses on prevention of cancer and create awareness in the community through campaigns and to involve the various stakeholders to plan and action.

b) Specific Objectives:

- 1. To make community involve in the role of bio-behavioural interventions, communications, and outcomes in reducing incidence of cancer.
- 2. To create awareness on improving, survival and quality of life with cancer including social, cultural, political and economic context of cancer prevention and control.
- 3. To mobilize available personal and material resources in community base and coordinate and capacitate the stakeholders/change agents for social causes and actions.

c) Activities implemented:

- 1) Safe food promotion Drives.
- 2) Awareness program to women groups on Cancer Care campaign.
- 3) Awareness program to Asha workers on Cancer Care campaign.
- 4) Training to Volunteers on Cancer Care campaign.
- 5) Cancer screening camp.
- 6) Innovation / Good practices for the benefit of the community with Cancer survivors/ Families / Dependents.

d) Results achieved:

- I. 12 Cancer Patients were provided Nutrition support.
- II. 200 women group members gained knowledge on cancer prevention.
- III. 60 Asha workers gained knowledge on cancer prevention.
- IV. 40 Youth and Asha workers volunteers gained knowledge on cancer prevention.
- V. 132 villagers participated cancer screening program. We have distributed free medicine for OI infections.
- VI. Nutrition gardens (each 20x10 feet) were established with fencing for 5 cancer patients.









7. CABA- (CLHA/CAA) Program - Children Affected by AIDS

1) <u>Project objective:</u> Empowering Children Affected / Infected by <u>HIV/AIDS</u> (CABA) through Linkages, Skill Building and Peer Support services in India.

2) Activities taken:

- 1) Nutrition Support to HIV Infected Children
